Actions funded or part funded by Pupil Premium:

- Additional staffing costs – employing a HLTA to work in one class to support Literacy (including delivering a reading programme to sustain progress in reading) and Maths, and boost confidence in learning.
- Extra-curricular clubs attended and extra-curricular activities provided

Impact of actions:

- Children attending extra-curricular activities and clubs sustained good social relationships with peers which has continued the increase in confidence for these children and enabled a sustained improvement in behaviour for learning – focus, concentration and perseverance.
- Delivery of the BRP intervention to boost reading has sustained the progress of 1 child in reading.
- For 2 children the average attendance is 97.2%, much improved on last year's 94.5%.
